Through the columns of your esteemed newspaper, I wish to bring to the notice of the authorities the reasons of student indiscipline and some suggestions which in my opinion, will go a long way in removing it.

The genesis or the main root cause of the problem can be traced to three factors, the display of indiscipline by elders, system of education and uncertainty of future after completing education. Fear of unemployment or underpaid employment drives many students to despair or to the state of having lost all hope. Let the young men of India be convinced that their future is not in dark. By various means and sources, it would be possible to create among students a love of beauty and refinement and a hatred for ugliness, vulgarity and violence in act and word. Student indiscipline is a disgrace to our system of education and to our society. Better and better paid teachers are the first need. Smaller and more manageable classes are required at least fifty percent of students should have free studentship and other facilities and amenities. Evening and Sunday classes are expected to result in a greater percentage of passes. These some of the suggestions are to be taken into practice. Students should remain aloof or free from being made tools for fulfilling the aims or subjects of politicians. The teacher must show and direct the right directions of guidance to the students as and when required to them.

It is the responsibility of students as well as teachers to wipe out this disgrace from the society.

Dear Sir,

Through the columns of your esteemed newspaper, I wish to bring to the notice of the authorities the reasons and causes of rising prices and some suggestions in my opinion to control the same.

"The success of your plan, depends on holding the price line." Prices have been rising in India for many years. Though the Price stable policy is the best policy but the greatest rise has been in the price of grain or cereals and other food-stuffs. The prices of essential goods must be stable so that the consumer must know the market price of the things which they want to intend to purchase. The essential commodities must be available to the consumers at fixed rates and the businessman must arrange for it with their minimum profits. The Government must keep proper watch upon the businessman regarding their books of accounts and payment of taxes, etc. Sometimes in case of scarcity of essential commodities like food grains cereals, sugar, cloths, oil and rice etc., the Government must open fair price shops for availability of these things to the consumers without trouble. Otherwise the big businessman hoards the goods and earns much profit by selling the things on higher prices or sometimes on the cost of as per their desires or wish. For checking the rise in the prices State Government must declare or announce the rate of various food stuffs before crops comes in the market.

In case of shortage of a thing in one State and availability in surplus in another State the regulation of inter-State movement must be there. So that the needed items may be sent to the needed areas.

As a result of price rise there have been demands on a very large scale for higher wages and higher salaries and dearness allowances. If the demands are not fulfilled the country-wide strike of teachers, administrative staff, bank employees and various other workers in other fields of life may take the shelter of this last resort of strike and the functioning of all machinery may paralyze. Therefore in case of rise in prices must be check up at earliest possible by the concerning authorities because it is deemed that rise in prices recklessly is to play with fire. To fight with this problem Government must keep proper or adequate stock to face any deficiency of foodgrains or other essential commodities. The Government must keep constant vigilance on price line and high moral businessman must be encouraged.

Through the columns of your esteemed newspaper, I wish to bring to the notice of the authorities the reasons of food problem and some suggestions in my opinion to solve this problem.

Though India is facing so many problems like of language problem, students unrest, law and orders, unemployment problems etc. among these problems, food problem is also one of the acute problem which India is facing. There are various reasons for outcoming this problem. The rapid increase of population combined with other causes and circumstances has created a widespread problem. About forty years ago we had a surplus food production. Our population had nearly doubled during this period. The result of this rapid increase of population have today deficit in food production and self-sufficiency in feeding our people.

Among so many reasons of food crisis and its low production is over fragmentation of agricultural farms and field resulting uneconomic holding. Hoarding by profiteers is also one of the main cause of food problem. Irrigation facilities are not adequate. Lack of insufficiency of manures and better varieties of seeds is also one of the reasons of low production. Pests and rats, monkeys, cattle and crop diseases causes a considerable fall in our food production. Some times heavy rains means flood and some time lack of rains means droughts periodically causes widespread destruction to our crops. Several forests have been cut down to create more fields. Though the forests bring rains.

The farmers of our country are uneducated. They are not having the knowledge of developed techniques, not only this most of the farmers have no good arrangements for storing foodgrains. Millions of beggars and *sadhus* do not produce anything but they used to eat on the cost of the society.

Before some time food problem was an immense problem but now by adopting some of the measures such as family planning for controlling population, providing good quality seeds to the farmers, spreading over irrigational facilities and distributing the medicines for preserving the standing crops are some of the measures which our Government have taken to solve this problem. Our Government is not sitting idle in this respect. Several measures like scientific experiments discovery of new food materials, our research institutes, our co-operative societies, new methods of agriculture have removed the problem upto some extent and India is now becoming self-sufficient in the field of food production.
