What is Adolescence?

- Adolescence (from Latin *adolescere*, meaning 'to grow up') is a transitional stage of physical and psychological development that generally occurs during the period from puberty to legal adulthood (age of majority).
- ➤ Adolescence is usually associated with the teenage years, but its physical, psychological or cultural expressions may begin earlier and end later.
- ➤ Adolescence Shows ^physical growth (particularly in males) and cognitive development which can extend into the early twenties.
- > Adolescence age provides only a rough marker of adolescence, and

scholars have found it difficult to agree upon a precise definition of adolescence.

According to A.T. Jersild-

"Adolescence is a span of fears during which boys and girls move from childhood to adulthood mentally, emotionally, socially and physically".
